DURING THE INTERNSHIP

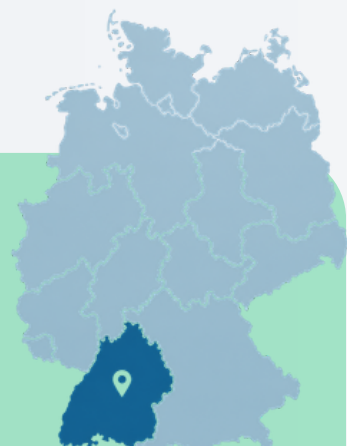
We stay connected with you & the participant throughout the three-month placement.
